

Purpose: to approve \$3,003,441 from the UUF) for the Navajo Election Administration to pay for its expenses in preparation for the upcoming 2022 Navajo Nation elections.

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY; APPROVING \$3,003,441 FROM THE

NAVAJO ELECTION ADMINISTRATION FOR ITS EXPENSES IN
PREPARATION FOR THE 2022 NAVAJO NATION ELECTIONS;
WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F), §820(J), AND §820(L)

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A). As such, the Council may consider proposed legislation regarding an emergency matter. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16).
- B. “[M]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council.” 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(16).
- C. At this time, the Navajo Nation Council is deeply concerned that the Navajo Election Administration (“NEA”) currently does not have enough funds in its budget to adequately

1 prepare for and properly conduct, all of the 2022 primary and general elections that will
2 be held across the Navajo Nation, or to fulfill its postelection duties to count all legitimate
3 votes cast and publish all election results.

4 D. The Navajo Nation Council therefore finds that the NEA's request for \$3,003,441 in
5 supplemental funding, as explained below, is indeed an emergency matter because the
6 NEA's lack of funds "directly threaten[s] the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation" and there
7 certainly exists a "pressing public need" for the requested funds.

8 E. The Navajo Nation Council is empowered to approve supplemental appropriations during
9 the current fiscal year if, and when, additional incoming revenue to the Navajo Nation is
10 expected to surpass initial or current revenue projections, and such revenue exceeds the 10%
11 minimum reserve mandated by §820(J). 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

12 F. The restrictions on supplemental appropriations, including all amounts from the UUFB,
13 include:

14 1. Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues,
15 and payment of nonrecurring expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB
16 funds. 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F).

17 2. Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or
18 operations. 12 N.N.C. §820(J), §820(L).

19 3. Nonrecurring revenues, such as UUFB funds, may be used only after the Controller
20 determines whether or not such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the
21 Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and government expenditures shall
22 only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year year) forecast shows that the operating
23 deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues will be added to the
24 Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance. 12 N.N.C. §820(F).

25 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the
26 full Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. §820(F), 12 N.N.C. §880.

27 5. In compliance with 12 N.N.C. §820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by
28 the Controller. Such review is also required because the Controller determines which
29 revenues and expenses are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

30 6. In compliance with 12 N.N.C. §820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to

1 the Office of Management and Budget (“OMB”) for a budget impact analysis.

2 7. Supplemental funding such as UUFB appropriations shall lapse at the end of the current
3 fiscal year unless the Navajo Nation Council decides otherwise. 12 N.N.C. §820(N).

5 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

6 A. The Navajo Election Administration (“NEA”) is requesting \$3,003,441 out of the UUFB to
7 purchase office equipment and supplies, and to cover its operating expenses for the remainder
8 of FY2022. NEA believes this funding request should be viewed as an emergency matter,
9 because such expenses are necessary for NEA to adequately prepare for the upcoming 2022
10 Navajo Nation primary and general elections to be conducted across the Navajo Nation.

11 B. NEA has provided a memorandum regarding its need for the \$3,003,441 in additional
12 funding, explaining that NEA is currently using outdated and obsolete equipment and
13 software that are inadequate for the upcoming 2022 Navajo Nation elections. **EXHIBIT A.**

14 C. NEA has prepared appropriate Budget Forms regarding its funding request. **EXHIBIT B.**

15 D. The Controller has been asked to prepare a memorandum regarding this funding request, to
16 comply with 12 N.N.C. §820(F) and §820(L). This memorandum may be provided to the
17 assigned Committees and the Council when this legislation is up for consideration.

18 E. OMB was asked to prepare a budget impact analysis regarding this funding request, to
19 comply with 12 N.N.C. §820(M). This analysis may be provided to the assigned Committees
20 and the Council when this legislation is up for consideration.

21 F. The Navajo Nation has determined that this legislation constitutes an emergency, because
22 the requested funds are needed to ensure bona fide 2022 elections across the Navajo Nation,
23 as well as proper post-election procedures for the counting of all votes and the publication of
24 final election results; voting must be easily accessible to all eligible Navajo voters.

25
26 **SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF \$3,003,441 FROM THE UUFB FOR THE NEA’S**
27 **EXPENSES IN PREPARATION FOR THE UPCOMING 2022**
28 **NAVAJO NATION ELECTIONS**

29 A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves a supplemental appropriation of \$3,003,441 out of the
30 UUFB for the Navajo Election Administration to cover its expenses in preparation for the

1 upcoming 2022 Navajo Nation primary and general elections, in accordance with the
2 attached EXHIBIT A and EXHIBIT B.

3 B. The \$3,003,441 in UUFB funds approved herein shall be from those revenues that exceed
4 the 10% minimum balance of the UUFB, which amount must be maintained according to
5 12 N.N.C. §820(J).

6 C. The \$3,003,441 approved herein shall **not** lapse at the end of Fiscal Year 2022, as would
7 otherwise occur pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §820(N), and all unexpended and/or unencumbered
8 amounts shall carry over to NEA's Budget for FY2023.

9
10 **SECTION FOUR. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F), §820(J), and §820(L)**

11 The Navajo Nation hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F), §820(J), and §820(L) to allow
12 use of the \$3,003,441 in UUFB funds by NEA for its necessary expenditures in preparation for
13 the upcoming 2022 Navajo Nation primary and general elections. This waiver is necessary
14 because the proposed NEA expenditures are considered recurring government expenses.

15
16 **SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE**

17 This Act shall become effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(17).

18
19 **SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE**

20 If any portion of this Act is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a
21 District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the
22 remainder of this Act shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.



Subject: Emergency Legislation for Primary and General Election

The Navajo Nation Election Administration (NEA) promotes democracy through each Navajo registered member who is eligible to vote; individual votes create personal choice to vote, not voting is giving up your voice, votes determine funding, and most importantly it gives opportunities to make changes. NEA serves the entire NN population including, not limited to stateside and overseas voters. The NEA has a total of 20 staff; 10 staff at Central office and 10 staff at the five agencies. The agency offices are located in Tuba City, Arizona, Chinle Arizona, Ft. Defiance Arizona, Crownpoint New Mexico, and in Shiprock New Mexico. The Agency NEA staff provided daily services to the Navajo eligible registered voters on a daily basis with:

1. Register new votes
2. Re-register inactive voters
3. Verify voter's registration
4. Collaborate with 110 chapters on registration
5. Coordinate and conduct primary and general, special elections, challenge, and recall elections
6. Orientate poll official training to chapter officials and general public
7. Conduct Registration training to registers
8. Temporary staff to assist with primary and general election
9. Out Research and Education
10. Report tally votes
11. Disseminate Navajo Nation, state, county and federal election and registration information, policies, certification processes, interpret election codes
12. Assist potential candidates with application process, certification, recount.

The Navajo Nation Department Currently the Navajo Nation Election Office operates on Voters Registration System (VRS):

1. Navajo Nation Department of Information Technology (DIT) has strongly advised the NEA to seek a new Voters Registration Software, the current software is outdated with strong possibility of crashing. When the system crashes NN DIT cannot make repairs.
2. Navajo Nation DIT strongly advised NEA to get a new Voters Registration Software for Central office and the 5 agencies
3. Current NEA computers and software are not compatible to Election Data Base
4. The current Voter Registration Software is a high risk for breaching voters' confidential records upon system failure
5. Unable to generate needed reports for reporting
6. VRS unable to connect to the internet

The Agency NEA staff are forced to set up tables and voting machines outside on gravel to conduct voting, use their own funds and equipment i.e. laptops, cell phones to carry daily task, and switch carriers to accommodate demand for communication. NEA staff carry out daily duties on outdated and unreliable computers and software (i.e. Windows 7, voter data base).

Due to COVID 19 Pandemic, the NEA staff experienced psychological setbacks including fear of contracting the COVID 19 virus and possible exposure to their families through their interactions with the public. Poll officials were exposed to and contracted the virus, while others backed away from work during the 2020 Navajo Nation election due to fear of getting sick. Because of this, some agencies were left shorthanded which caused added pressure and irregularities in work schedule.

The funds requested will be used to purchase the following for the Window Rock Navajo Election Office and the 5 NEA offices:

- **Election Voter Registration software (license)**
 - Data Base
 - Election supplies and equipment's
 - Desk top Computers
 - Laptops
 - Desks
 - Fire proof cabinets
 - Desk Phones
 - Printers
 - Portables printers
 - Scanners
 - Copiers (small and large)
 - Transcribers
 - Better internet connection/service
 - Hot Spots for remote work
 - 150 IPAD for 110 Chapters and NEA staff
 - Ballots for General elections
 - Personnel overtime during elections
 - Senior Programmer Analyst – new position to administer new database
 - Education, training for NEA staff, board, and poll judges

To effectively and properly serve Navajo voters on the Navajo Nation and beyond, the NEA and agency offices will address the following:

- Increase effective sufficient communication in disseminating election information to voters and the general public.
- The NEA will need a Senior Programmer Analyst to administer the new database and election software to generate valuable reports, in addition the Programmer will have overall maintenance the Election system.
- New software and hardware office equipment will not only increase energy savings and create a greener office environment, it will also decrease services time for customers. Currently, customers have to wait for services due to non-functioning software and computers
- New office equipment's use minimal energy compared to old equipment's
- New reliable updated laptop & desktop computers are direly needed to conduct daily duties (i.e. Windows 10 or newer) with the general public
- A new Voters Registration Software is critically needed to store confidential information

The Navajo People choose their elect local, state, and federal level leaders through votes, it is critical the People and employees are safe from the COVID19 while administering their duties and responsibilities. The NEA conduct the following elections in staggered years:

1. Early voting for elected officials
2. Absentee voting
3. Recall Elections



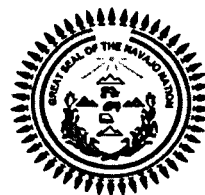
Please review this legislation to make sure it is drafted to your satisfaction, and that all necessary and appropriate supporting documents have been provided and all attached Exhibits are correct.
