D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A).
 E. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. "The Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at §820(J)." 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

- F. The restrictions on supplemental appropriations include:
 - Supplemental appropriations from non-recurring revenues shall be approved only for non-recurring expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(F). The Controller designates which revenues are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
 - 2. The Navajo Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance costs, from recurring revenues only. Long-term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(E).
 - 3. The Navajo Nation Code further provides, ". . . non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. §820(F).
 - 4. All requests for supplemental funding shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. §820(M).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

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A. The Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources ("DNR") has prepared a Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary (Appendix K) dated June 21, 2021. DNR seeks \$1,962,149 out of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to address drought conditions at the Navajo Nation's Colorado ranches in Huerfano and Custer counties, where the Boyer Ranch and the Wolf Springs Ranch are located. **EXHIBIT A**. B. The DNR has also submitted Budget Forms 1, 2, and 4. **EXHIBIT B**. A detailed description of the need for drought mitigation efforts at the two ranches is included in all supporting documents at Exhibit A and Exhibit B.

C. This supplemental funding request has been submitted through the Navajo Nation's Section 164 Review process, and the Office of Management and Budget, the Office of the Controller, and the Department of Justice, have all determined that this request is proper and legally sufficient. **EXHIBIT C**.

D. The Office of the Controller has also issued a memorandum dated July 27, 2021, satisfy the requirements under 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). **EXHIBIT D**. The Controller has identified the proposed expenditures by DNR as NON-RECURRING.

E. In accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), the Office of Management and Budget did review this funding proposal during the Section 164 Review process, as shown in Exhibit C.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$1,962,149 IN UUFB SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING TO THE NNDNR FOR DROUGHT MITIGATION AT THE COLORADO RANCHES

A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$1,962,149 in supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Division of Natural Resources for drought mitigation efforts at the Navajo Nation's Boyer Ranch and Wolf Springs Ranch in Colorado.
B. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,962,149 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller.

C. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,962,149 shall be available until fully expended and shall not lapse on September 30, 2022.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(17).

SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo

The Office of Management and Budget/Budget Section reviewed the proposed legislation and provides the following:

- 1. The FY 2022 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XII (the Supplemental Funding Request Procedures), states the Navajo Nation Leadership should carefully weigh the laws, priorities and any extenuating circumstances before consideration of supplemental funding requests. Further, the Nation is to consider court mandates, required matching funds, the health and safety of the general public, emergency situations, unmet needs, and other extenuating circumstances, which may arise during the fiscal year.
- 2. During the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Process, there was approximately \$24 million in Unmet Needs supported by the Legislative Oversight Committees by resolutions. The DNR F&W/Colorado Ranch was part of the Unmet Needs for \$167,000 to address drought conditions. \$100,000 of the Unmet Need was funded per the FY 2022 Budget Resolution CS-49-21, Exhibit G. Business Unit No. 115044 was assigned. The budget includes \$69,700 for operating supplies to purchase hay and feed, and \$30,300 for consulting fees for water distribution, range and habitat improvements. To date, \$49,524.05 was spent for operating supplies. The consulting fees remains unspent.
- 3. Note, the supplemental funding request from June is for \$1.9 million. The Unmet Need request from July is for \$167,000 of which \$100,000 was funded.
- 4. The FY 2022 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XII, B. states if a supplemental request is not funded in a previous fiscal year, the proposal must be revised and resubmitted for the current fiscal year.
 - a. The budget forms attached to the legislation are FY 2021 Budget Forms and dated June 2021. In accordance with the '22 BIM, the forms need to be updated.
 - b. Further, the budget forms need to be updated to reflect the current need since a portion was already funded.

- 5. According to the Controller's Report dated October 13, 2021 the UUFB (Undesignated, Unreserved Fund Balance) is \$25,786,238 as of September 30, 2021. During the 2021 Fall Session, the Navajo Nation Council appropriated \$1,819,950 as follows:
 - a. \$258,512 for Tohatchi Area of Opportunity and Services, Inc. (TAOS) per CO-54-21.
 - b. \$1,561,438 for Judicial Branch (\$961,438) and Election Office (\$600,000) per CO-55-21.

Thus reducing the UUFB to \$23,966,288.

The Office of Management and Budget/Budget Section reviewed the proposed legislation and provides the following:

- The FY 2022 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XII (the Supplemental Funding Request Procedures), states the Navajo Nation Leadership should carefully weigh the laws, priorities and any extenuating circumstances before consideration of supplemental funding requests. Further, the Nation is to consider court mandates, required matching funds, the health and safety of the general public, emergency situations, unmet needs, and other extenuating circumstances, which may arise during the fiscal year.
- 2. During the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget Process, there was approximately \$24 million in Unmet Needs supported by the Legislative Oversight Committees by resolutions. The DNR F&W/Colorado Ranch was part of the Unmet Needs for \$167,000 to address drought conditions. \$100,000 of the Unmet Need was funded per the FY 2022 Budget Resolution CS-49-21, Exhibit G. Business Unit No. 115044 was assigned. The budget includes \$69,700 for operating supplies to purchase hay and feed, and \$30,300 for consulting fees for water distribution, range and habitat improvements. To date, \$49,524.05 was spent for operating supplies. The consulting fees remains unspent.
- 3. Note, the supplemental funding request from June is for \$1.9 million. The Unmet Need request from July is for \$167,000 of which \$100,000 was funded.
- 4. The FY 2022 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XII, B. states if a supplemental request is not funded in a previous fiscal year, the proposal must be revised and resubmitted for the current fiscal year.
 - a. The budget forms attached to the legislation are FY 2021 Budget Forms and dated June 2021. In accordance with the '22 BIM, the forms need to be updated.
 - b. Further, the budget forms need to be updated to reflect the current need since a portion was already funded.

- 5. According to the Controller's Report dated October 13, 2021 the UUFB (Undesignated, Unreserved Fund Balance) is \$25,786,238 as of September 30, 2021. During the 2021 Fall Session, the Navajo Nation Council appropriated \$1,819,950 as follows:
 - a. \$258,512 for Tohatchi Area of Opportunity and Services, Inc. (TAOS) per CO-54-21.

b. \$1,561,438 for Judicial Branch (\$961,438) and Election Office (\$600,000) per CO-55-21. Thus reducing the UUFB to \$23,966,288.
