The provisions of this legislation which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

SECTION SEVEN. SAVINGS CLAUSE

Should any provisions of this legislation be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this legislation which are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation. *Office of Legislative Counsel Telephone: (928) 871-7166 Fax # (928) 871-7576*

- 2. Pursuant to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee Resolution HEHSCJY-04-16; Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council Plan of Operation; Section I, II, III, IV, V, VI; The Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council is duly recognized by the Navajo Nation.
- 3. The Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council recognizes, understands and acknowledges NNVA Office Staff Shall Provide financial update, assistance, technical support and clarification, and shall maintain each fund account and provide monthly financial reports to each CVO.
- 4. The Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council recognizes, understands and acknowledges need for these changes to happen and to be established in order for the Navajo Nation Veterans Housing Program to function appropriately, and
