AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT,
BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES,
AND TO THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$7,650,000
FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE
CHILCHINBETO MULTI-PURPOSE BUILDING; APPROVING THE
RELATED EXPENDITURE PLAN PURSUANT TO 12 N.N.C §2501 – §2508

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with oversight authority over all 110 Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §500(C) and 26 N.N.C. §102.
- B. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the responsibility to “review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment and management of all funds.” 2 N.N.C. §301(B)(2).
- C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council that considers all proposed final actions by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A). As such, the Council may approve appropriations from the Navajo Nation's Síhasin Fund.

1 E. 12 N.N.C. §2502, as amended by CJA-03-18, states the purpose of the Navajo Nation Síhasin
2 Fund (“Síhasin Fund”) as follows:

3 §2502 Purpose

4 A. The purposes of this Fund are to provide financial support and/or financing for:

5 1. The planning and development of economic development and regional
6 infrastructure supporting economic development and community
7 development, including such infrastructure as, but not limited to, housing,
8 commercial and government buildings, waterline, solid waste management
9 development, powerline projects, and transportation and communication
10 systems, within the Navajo Nation; . . .

11 B. For the Purpose in §2502(A)(1), Fund expenditures for infrastructure shall
12 not be limited by 12 N.N.C. §1310(F) or TCDCJY-77-99.

13 C. Leveraging the Fund by way of guaranteeing loans, match funding, direct
14 funding in part, and other weighted uses of the Fund, including loan financing
15 from the Fund, for the purposes in §2502(A)(1), shall be favored over direct
16 funding in whole.

17 F. The Síhasin Fund provides that “Fund Principal” shall consist of all deposits made to the
18 Síhasin Fund and that “Fund Income” shall consist of all earnings (interest, dividends, etc.)
19 generated and realized by the Fund Principal, and that Síhasin Fund Income shall be
20 deposited in, and added to, the Fund Principal until such time as a Fund Expenditure Plan is
21 duly approved. 12 N.N.C. §2504 and §2505(C).

22 G. The Síhasin Fund provides that “Fund Principal and Income shall not be expended except
23 pursuant to a Fund Expenditure Plan consistent with the purposes set forth in §2502 of this
24 Chapter and adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation
25 Council.” 12 N.N.C. §2505(A).

26
27 **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

28 A. The Chítchinbeto Chapter is a Local-Governance Certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation,
29 and as such it has the authority to enter into contracts for goods and services, and agreements
30 for the receipt of Navajo Nation funds. 26 N.N.C. §102, §103(D)(3), and §103(D)(6)-(7).

1 B. The Chilchinbeto Chapter is requesting \$7,650,000 from the Síhasin Fund for the
2 construction of a new multipurpose building in the Chilchinbeto community. The Chapter
3 explains its need and request for Síhasin funds in Chapter Resolutions No. CCH-11-24-
4 2021I, No. CCH-05-18-2021I, and No. CCH-08-21-19D. **EXHIBIT A.**

5 C. The Chilchinbeto Chapter Manager has provided a letter discussing the Chapter's funding
6 request for the Project, explaining that the original amount projected for construction costs
7 has increased from \$5,250,000 to an estimated \$7,650,000 because of rapidly increasing
8 construction costs. **EXHIBIT B.**

9 D. The Chapter Manager also explains that the Chapter has withdrawn a total of 81.52 acres for
10 a new chapter house and other economic development ventures in the community, and he
11 further notes that in November 2005, SHP Engineering and Architecture completed a market
12 and feasibility study for the withdrawn land. **EXHIBIT B.** Maps of the withdrawn area and
13 the proposed location of the new multipurpose building are attached hereto as **EXHIBIT C.**

14 E. In January 2015, an environmental assessment for the multipurpose building project was
15 completed by J.R. Analla EA Services. **EXHIBIT D** (full report available from Sponsor).

16 F. The Chilchinbeto multipurpose building Project was previously included in Navajo Nation
17 Council Resolution No. CAP-35-18, wherein the Council approved \$300,000 for the Project.
18 **EXHIBIT E.** The Chapter has expended these funds on planning and design for the Project.

19 G. Allocation of the \$7,650,000 as requested by the Chilchinbeto Chapter meets the criteria for
20 Síhasin expenditures because the proposed expenditure involves the construction of a
21 multipurpose building for the Chilchinbeto community and supports economic and
22 community development in the area, as described in 12 N.N.C. §2502(A)(1).

23
24 **SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$7,650,000 FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND FOR THE**
25 **CONSTRUCTION OF THE CHILCHINBETO MULTI-PURPOSE**
26 **BUILDING; APPROVING THE RELATED EXPENDITURE**
27 **PLAN FOR THE PROJECT**

28 A. In accordance with 12 N.N.C. §2505(A), the Navajo Nation hereby approves \$7,650,000 out
29 of the Síhasin Fund for the Chilchinbeto Chapter to pay for the construction of a new
30 multipurpose building for the Chapter, as explained in the EXHIBITS A- D attached hereto.

1 B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Expenditure Plan for the construction of the
2 multipurpose building, as set forth in EXHIBITS A-D.

3 C. The \$7,650,000 in Sihasin funds approved in this Act may be further leveraged by bond or
4 loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act (12 N.N.C. §1300 *et seq.*,
5 as amended), using Sihasin Fund earnings for repayment and financing costs, upon approval
6 of the Budget and Finance Committee and upon further approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote
7 of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council.

8 D. The Office of the Controller shall determine whether the source of the \$7,650,000 approved
9 herein will be Sihasin Fund Principal or Sihasin Fund Income, or a combination of both.

10 E. The \$7,650,000 in Sihasin funds shall be disbursed to the Navajo Nation Division of
11 Community Development (“DCD”) within fourteen (14) business days after the effective
12 date of this Act. DCD shall then arrange for the Chilchinbeto Chapter’s use of the \$7,650,000
13 for the construction of the Chapter’s multipurpose building, in accordance with DCD’s usual
14 procedures for releasing Sihasin Funds to Chapters that are governance-certified under the
15 Local Governance Act (26 N.N.C. §102).

16 F. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(N) the \$7,650,000 allocation for the Chilchinbeto Chapter
17 approved herein shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year, so long as the Chapter accounts
18 for all Sihasin funds sitting in the Project account as of September 30, 2022, and budgets
19 such funds in the next fiscal year for the same multipurpose building Project.

20 G. Any and all savings or unused amounts of the Sihasin funds approved herein shall be
21 immediately returned to the Sihasin Fund Principal once the Chilchinbeto Chapter
22 multipurpose building project is completed.

23 H. The Sihasin Fund shall be reimbursed the \$7,650,000 amount approved herein, from funds
24 available to the Navajo Nation from any and all state and federal sources, including
25 Congressional appropriations under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 or other COVID-
26 19-related relief, so long as the Chapter expenditures described herein are deemed eligible
27 under such COVID-19-related or other funding sources.

28 29 **SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE**

30 This Act and the approved Expenditure Plan shall be effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §2505.

1 **SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE**

2 If any portion of this Act is invalidated by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by any
3 Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the
4 remainder of this Act shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

REQUESTING THE DPMD, NNDCD, AND ARPA REVIEWING COMMITTEE TO RECONSIDER FUNDING THE MULTIPURPOSE/MUSEUM ALONG ROUTE 59 IN PLACE OF PREVIOUSLY REJECTED C-STORE PROPOSAL.

Resolution # CCH-11-24-2021I

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to Title 26 N.N.C., Chilchinbeto Chapter is a Certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation and is delegated the authority and responsibility to promote projects which benefits the local community; and
2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C., Section 4028 (a), the Chilchinbeto Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and make appropriate recommendations to the Navajo Nation, Federal, State, and local agencies for appropriate actions; and
3. The Chilchinbeto Chapter does not have any sort of economic sustainability within the chapter boundaries where our recent application for C-Store did not meet the ARPA requirement, but a museum is also another shovel-ready project that was suggested to be one of our priority projects, and
4. Chilchinbeto Chapter has a large land withdrawn for development. A Multipurpose building project which will house a museum for the two (2) World's Largest Handwoven Navajo Rug was also a priority, but for some reason it was not pushed through ARPA priority projects for funding. This is a tourism capturing venture that must be funded, and
5. The multipurpose project has a complete design and engineering, complete architectural drawing, while water, 3 phase powerline, and the sewage are in the vicinity. Sewage development contract is underway and NTUA is in the process of building a 3rd cell lagoon. We have been waiting for the funding since 1989.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Chilchinbeto Chapter hereby approve and requesting to the CPMD, NNDCD, and the ARPA Reviewing Committee to reconsider funding the Multipurpose project in place of the C-Store that was denied, and

2. The Chilchinbeto Chapter further request that the Reviewing Committee, CPMD, and the NNDCD to do any and all things to grant the Multipurpose project in the amount of \$7,500,000.00 to complete the project.

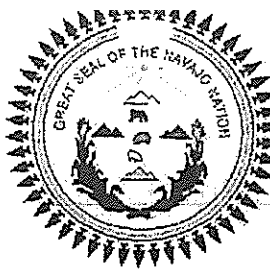

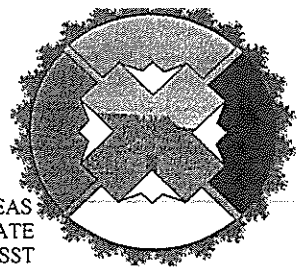

APPROVING AND REQUESTING THE NAVAJO NATION AND THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TO ALLOCATE \$7 PLUS MILLION DOLLARS TOWARD CHILCHINBETO CHAPTER FOR THE MULTI-PURPOSE AND THE C-STORE PROJECTS.

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to Title 26 N.N.C., Chilchinbeto Chapter is a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation and is delegated the authority and responsibility to promote projects which benefits the local community; and
2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C., Section 4028 (a), the Chilchinbeto Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and make appropriate recommendations to the Navajo Nation, Federal, State, and local agencies for appropriate actions; and
3. Chilchinbeto Chapter and its CLUPC has undertaken numerous times, effort, planning, designing, and completed overwhelming feasibility study in preparation to seek funding for the chapter projects. 5. Chilchinbeto Chapter is the epic center of Covid-19 in March of 2020 and many community members suffered the consequences. Chilchinbeto is committed to minimize their dependency on other nearby community frequencies for dry goods and produce to perpetuate health and safety for its people.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Chilchinbeto Chapter hereby respectively request the Navajo Nation Economic Development and the Navajo Nation Government to allocate \$7 million plus toward the cost of construction for the (2) two Chilchinbeto Chapter projects. Chilchinbeto Chapter further reminds the Navajo Nation and the Economic Development that the Chapter could've easily averted so many pandemic fatalities only if they had local Convenient Store and used the Multi-Purpose building for its storage of food, medicine, sanitizing material, and other supplies in addition to converting the building into a temporary hospital.

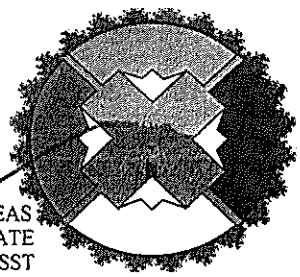

RE: Request to reconsider the project denial for another project.

Dear Mr. Platero;

Writing in request to your office, the CPMD, Navajo Nation Budget and Finance Committee, Navajo Nation Office of the President and Vice President, Office of the Navajo Nation Speaker of the Council, and especially the ARPA FRF Reviewing Committee.

I am requesting that since our C-Store project was denied for an ARPA FRF funding, we as the community and chapter of Chilchinbeto believe it was atrocious and unspeakable that our hope of bringing in an economic sustainable venture was preempted. When horses and wagon was the only transportation on the reservation, Trading Post were essential. In the midst of the rising cost of living, it is necessary to bring back the traditional Trading Post style of marketing and profiteering to return to the local community. The C-Store was a way to manage the cost of fuel, it was the key to real savings on food prices, and the only way to stretching the family. Especially for those that live on fixed income.

Since all this is no longer useful to discuss, we do believe we have a project, a shovel ready project with all assessments, easements, surveys, designs, engineering, right of ways, and land withdrawal are complete with a construction architectural design. This project is a Multipurpose/museum building that will house the community's two (2) renowned World Largest Handwoven Navajo Rugs in the museum which will be internally built.

So, the proposed size of this building is 11,496 sq. feet. of which the gathering room measures 4,232 sq. feet will be the convertible proposed museum. This is where the two (2) rugs will be displayed for tourist to come visit. This paramount important accomplishment in our community must be made available for the world to come and see. Currently, these two (2) rugs are folded

away in the Navajo Nation Museum hidden away and not returning any revenues to the Chilchimbeto Chapter or the community. It is actually just wasting away 24/7 and should the leaders of diverse color of authority continue to allow this sadness to persist? This is an irresponsible reality at this time.

Next, we have additional 1,781 sq. feet of proposed Gallery and another 580 sq. feet of Gift Shop that will complement the textile displayed in the museum.


Finally, there is 2,020 sq. feet of proposed restaurant area inside the building where the tourist can refresh and dine as they visit the museum. Surely, we have not all forgotten that Chilchimbeto was the epic center of covid 19 only a year and to this day covid remains to high in our community.

Please, reconsider the reasons you took away the C-Store. But at this time choose to bring in the other important project to our community. It is shovel ready project and take the time to look at it. It meets the requirement for the ARPA Funding guideline.

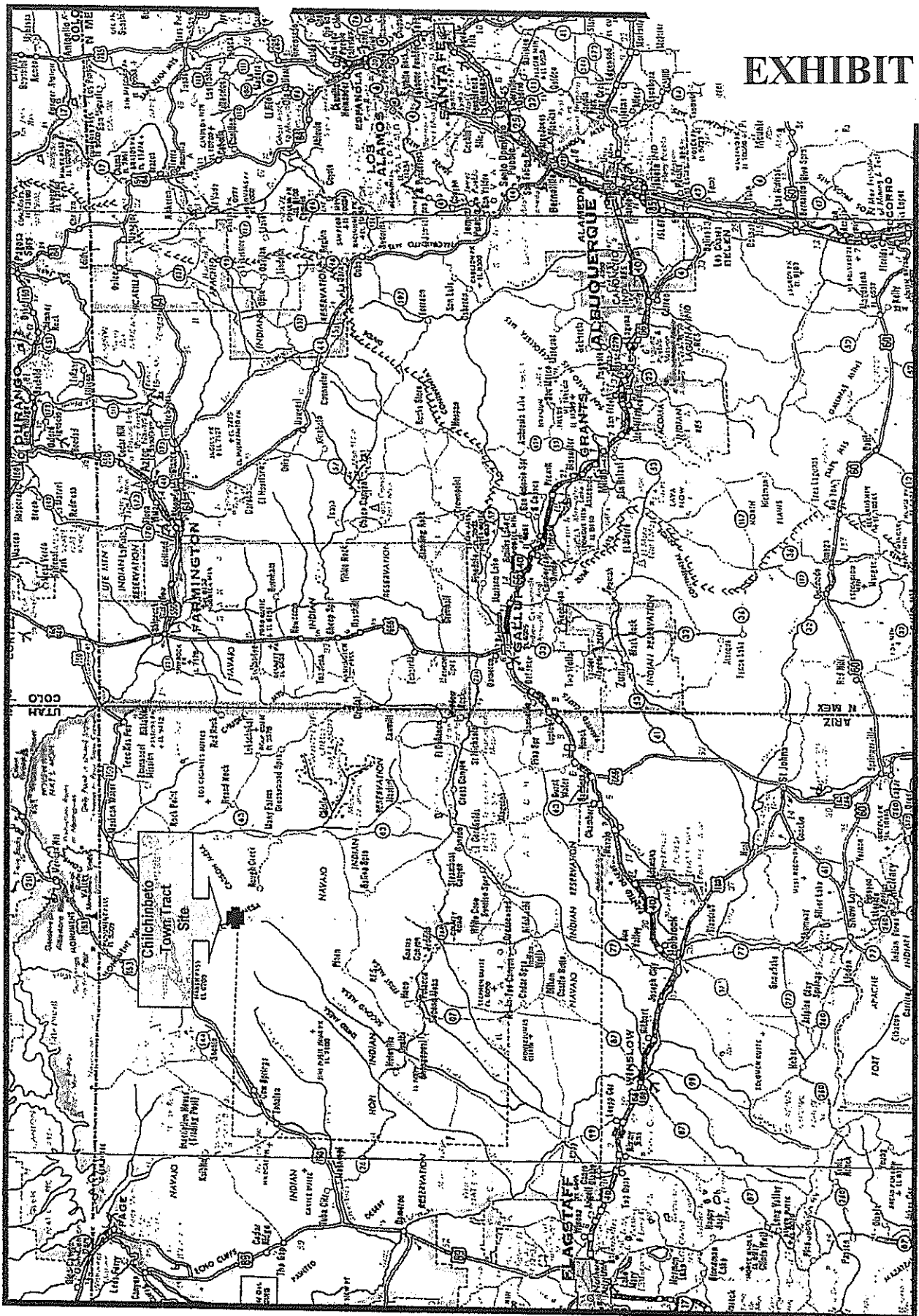

Chilchinbeto Chapter



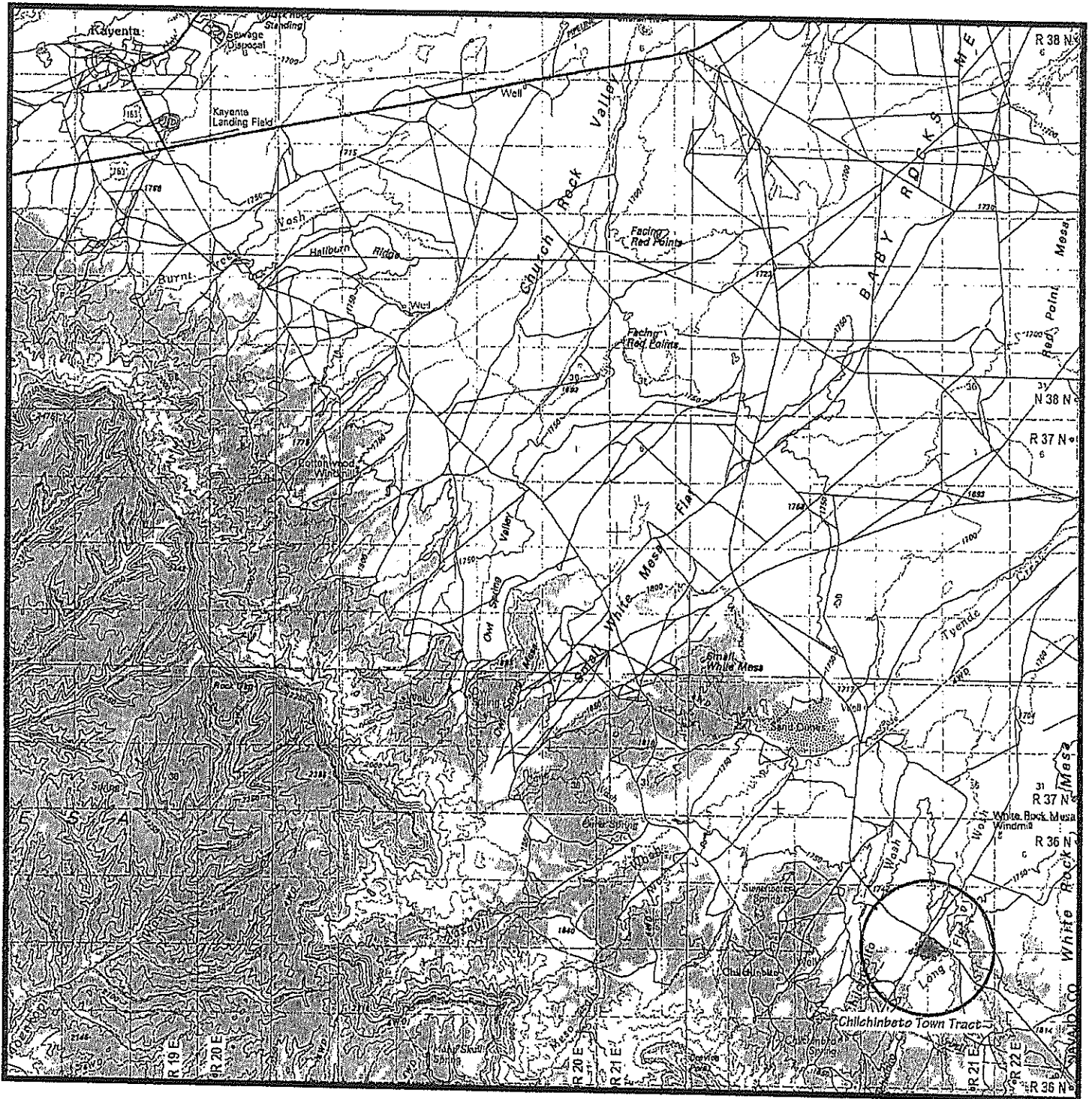


Figure Sheet 2

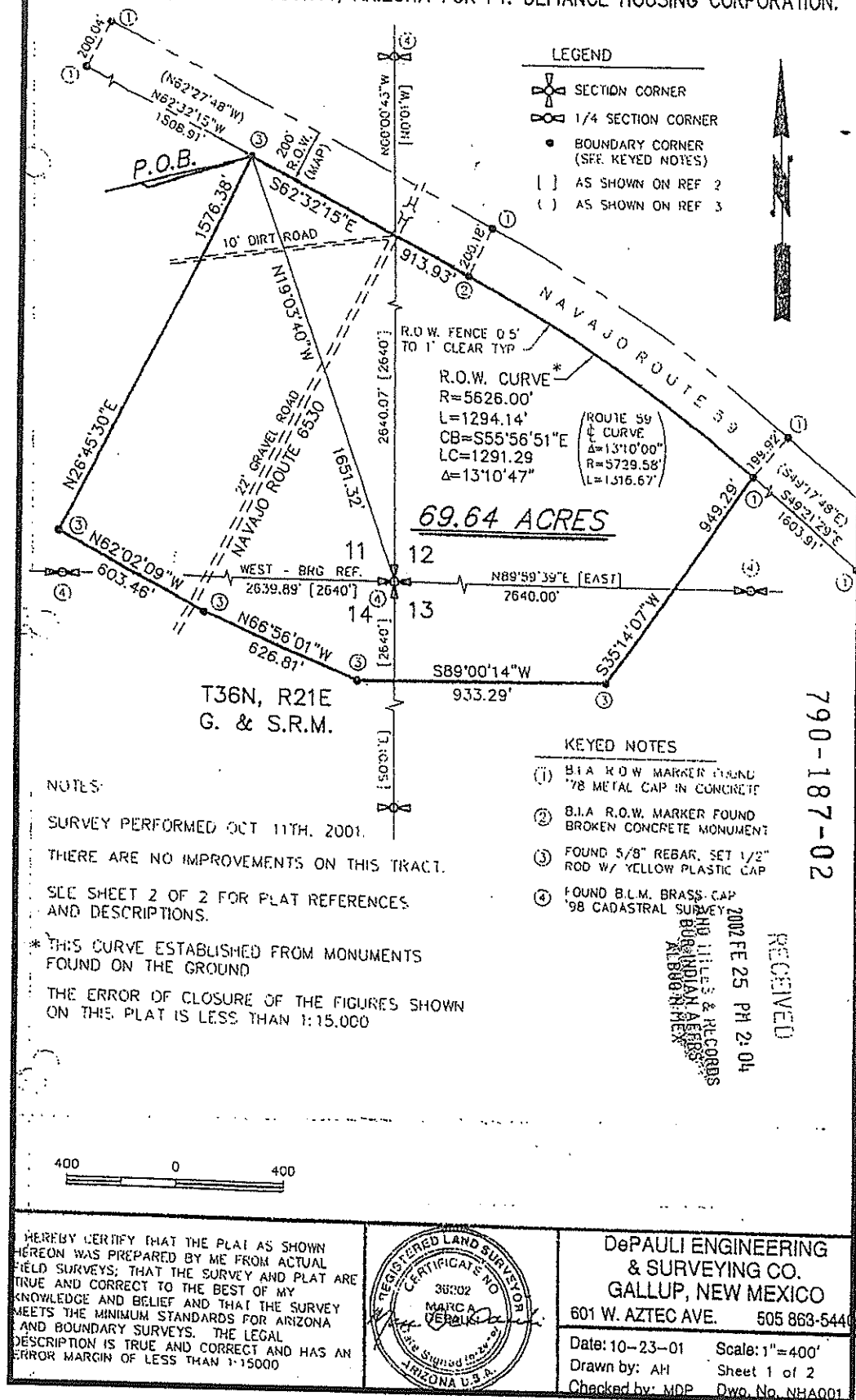
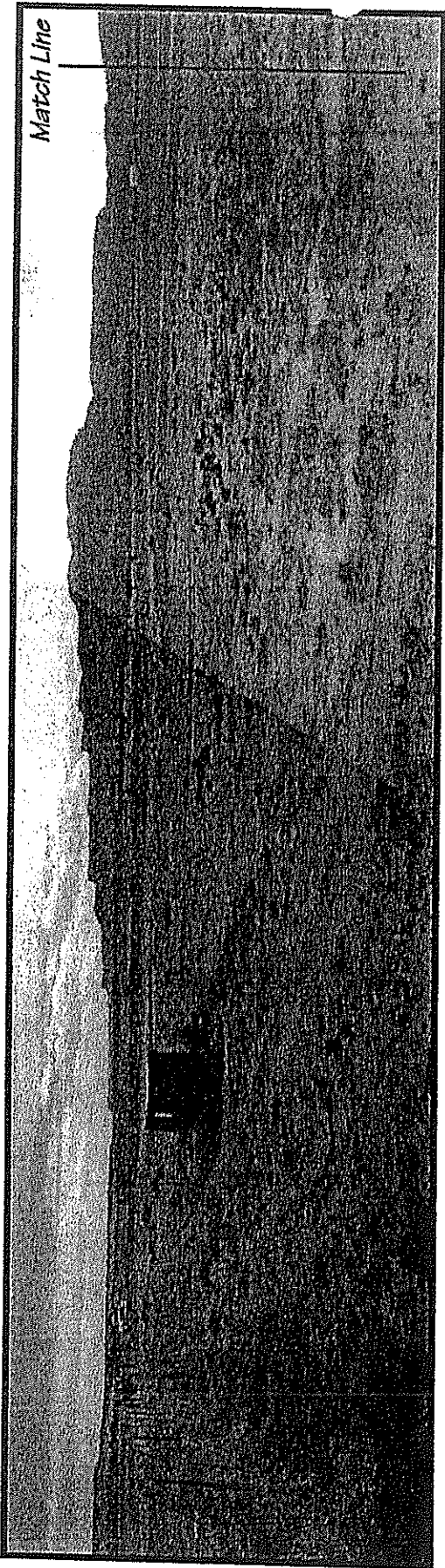
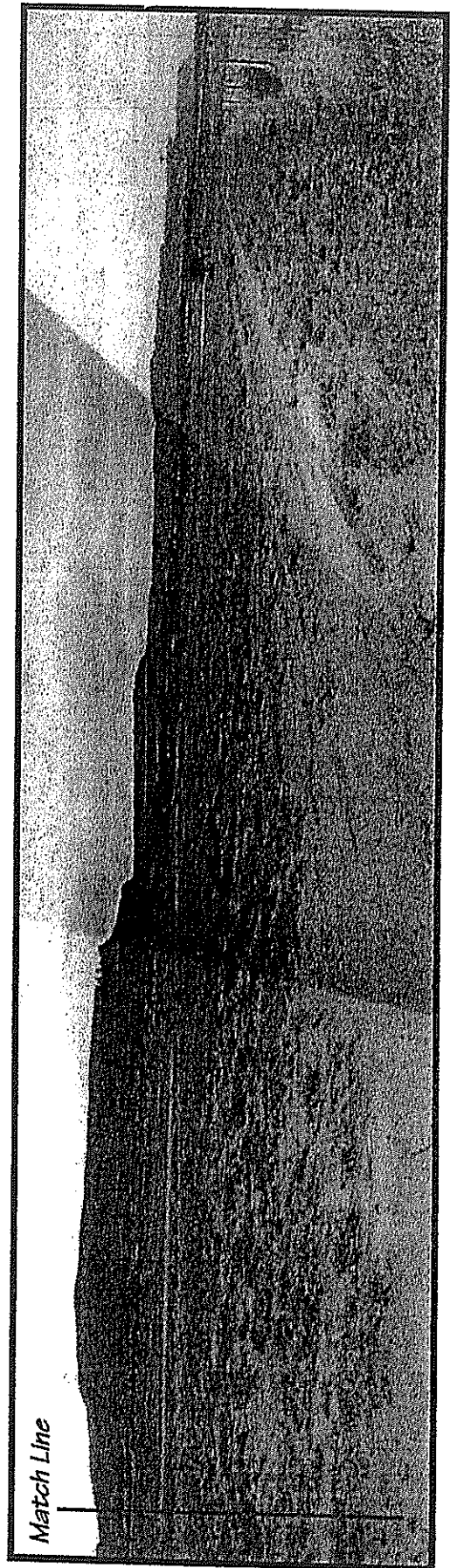

Executive Summary

This environmental assessment has been prepared in accordance with *Sections 101 and 102 of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, As amended, Regulations for Implementing the Procedural Provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act, 40 CFR Parts 1500-1508 and Bureau of Indian Affairs NEPA Handbook, 516 DM. 59 IAM 3*. The environmental assessment is an instrument required by federal law and regulations to determine if potential impacts of a federal action are of such significance as to require the preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The federal action for this undertaking is the approval, by the BIA, of the withdrawal of a site encompassing 69.64± acres or a community development site by the Chilchinbeto Chapter (CC). The proposed site is being proposed by the CC to provide social and community services for the residents of the CC. The CC is having this document prepared as an integral element of their Chapter Land Use Planning procedures to expedite development of chapter and social facilities in an orderly manner. This EA addresses potential environmental impacts which may result from the BIA approval of the proposed land withdrawal for Chapter use. The CCTT is located in Chilchinbeto, Chilchinbeto Chapter, Navajo County, State of Arizona.

Consultation has been conducted with the Navajo Nation Natural Heritage Program, Fish and Wildlife Department to identify federally listed threatened or endangered species, critical habitat or other species of concern that may exist in the project area.

Archaeological survey and report *A Cultural Resources Inventory of the Proposed Town Tract and Sewage Lagoon for the Chilchinbeto Chapter, Navajo County, Arizona DCD 97-071* was completed for the CCTT site. Consultation with the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department was initiated and *Cultural Resource Compliance Form NNHPD No. HPD-98-716* was issued on October 26, 1998.

This EA analyzes and evaluates the impacts of the proposed project and decision on a minority and low-income population and surrounding communities as mandated by *Executive Order 12898 (EO) of February 11, 1994, Federal Actions to address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations*. The EO requires federal agencies to incorporate environmental justice into their missions by identifying and addressing disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects of their programs and policies on minorities and low-income populations and communities. The EO applies equally to all Federal agencies responsible for Native American programs.

The assessments and determinations of final impacts contained in this EA were developed in accordance with the *CEQ Guidelines 40 CFR 1500*. *40 CFR 1500* provides that the EA shall include reasonable alternatives to the proposed action, identify a preferred alternative, give consideration to general and broad measures to minimize or eliminate adverse impacts and allow a final federal decision as to the need for an environmental impact statement (EIS) for the approval of the CCTT site withdrawal renewal.

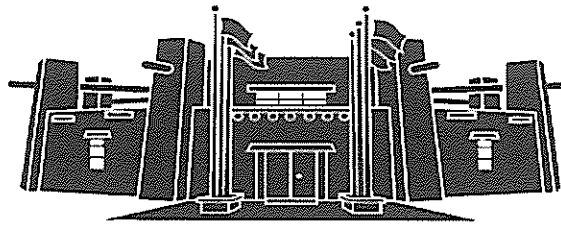
